Australia sits on top one of the fastestmoving tectonic plates in the world, moving about seven centimetres northeast every year




The longest river of Australia is the Murray River, it is 2,508 km long and provides water for 1.5 million homes.





Australia is an island surrounded by the Indian and the Pacific Ocean. It is the 6th largest country in the world.



















You might want to use these questions as a guideline whilst doing your research?
