
### NORTH AMERICA - SEQUOIA

The sequoia tree is a giant among trees, and it's one of the most amazing trees in the world. These magnificent trees can grow to be as tall as a 26-story building, reaching heights of up to 311 feet (95 meters). They are also incredibly old, with some sequoias living for more than 3,000 years! These remarkable giants have trunks that can span up to 40 feet (12 meters) in diameter, making them some of the largest living organisms on Earth.

- Trunk Diameter: Up to 40 feet (12 meters).


