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Your Instructions

This week, we have an exciting challenge for you! Imagine you're in Aisha's shoes—a tenth-grade student facing a significant decision. Every choice we make has consequences, both positive and negative, and sometimes making the right choice means thinking about the bigger picture.

This week, we'll explore the theme of "choice"—how the decisions we make today can shape our future. In real life, choices are not always easy, and they often require us to weigh different perspectives, think critically, and consider long-term effects.

To get started, read through Aisha's story and understand the different factors at play.

Once you've gone through the information, work with your team to come up with the best decision. Then, share your ideas with the class, participate in a debate, and vote on the best solution.

Step	Action
1	Step into Aisha's Shoes: Imagine you are Aisha, a tenth-grade student facing an important decision.
2	Understand the Power of Choice: Learn how decisions have long-term effects on our lives.
3	Read the Scenario: Go through Aisha's story and understand the different perspectives involved.
4	Discuss as a Team: Share your thoughts with your group and listen to different viewpoints.
5	Analyse the Impact: Think about the positive and negative consequences of Aisha's possible choices.
6	Brainstorm Solutions: Work with your team to find the best, most balanced solution.
7	Prepare a 2-Minute Talk: Develop a short presentation explaining your decision and its impact.
8	Present Your Decision: Share your choice with the class and justify your reasoning.
9	Vote as a Class: Cast an anonymous vote to decide the best solution.
10	Reflect and Discuss: Talk about what you learned and how choices shape our future.


Perspective is Everything
