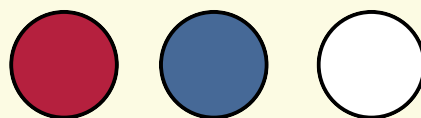
DESIGN AND SYMBOLS

Shape:

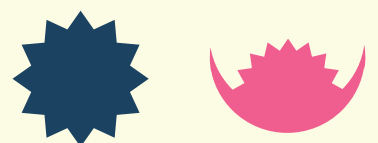
Colours:

The crimson red color symbolizes **bravery** and the Nepalese people's **spirit**, while the blue border represents peace and **harmony**.



Symbols:

The flag features a white sun and a crescent moon, which traditionally symbolize **victory and hope**.



Nepal, with its deep-rooted spiritual traditions, is widely known for the colorful prayer flags that flutter in the wind across the Himalayan landscape. These flags, often seen adorning temples, monasteries, mountain passes, and sacred sites, carry significant meaning in both Hinduism and Buddhism.

THE FIVE COLORS OF PRAYER FLAGS

- **Blue (Sky):** Symbolizing the sky, blue flags represent space, serenity, and infinite possibilities. They are often placed at the highest point among the flags.
- **White (Air):** Representing air and wind, white flags signify purity, peace, and wisdom. They are believed to carry prayers and mantras to the heavens.
- **Red (Fire):** Red flags symbolize fire and are associated with energy, strength, and protection. They are believed to ward off evil.
- **Green (Water):** Symbolizing water, green flags are associated with nature, growth, and prosperity.
- **Yellow (Earth):** Representing the earth, yellow flags symbolize groundedness and fertility, reminding practitioners of the physical world and its connection to the spiritual realm.

Prayers and mantras:

The flags are traditionally printed with sacred texts, prayers, and mantras, particularly from **Tibetan Buddhism**. The wind is believed to spread these prayers across the world, promoting peace, compassion, and wisdom.

While originating in Tibetan Buddhism, prayer flags have been embraced in Nepalese culture across different religions, symbolizing a harmonious blend of beliefs.



Renewal and Impermanence:

The flags are left to fade and deteriorate, symbolizing the Buddhist teachings of impermanence. New flags are often hung alongside or replace the old, representing **renewal** and the continuous cycle of life.
