This week, you have a special job: assist with Gender Equality! Your job, Pick a task you like from Sustainable Development Goal 5: Gender Equality. Work on your own, with a group or a class and spend your week trying to achieve as many form the list below as you can.

Assess the amount of boys and girls in your school or community. Do they all have access to the same things? List down what services, clubs, situations or choices are not accessible to the other gender and identify if any of these can be made accessible to everyone.

Start a Book Club: Focus
on books written by both
men and women and
about strong characters.
Discuss these stories and
what they teach us about
equality and
empowerment.

Host a Gender Equality Film Festival: Select films and documentaries that explore gender issues, followed by discussions. It's a great way to learn more about gender equality around the world and spark conversation.

Community Library Project:
Set up a community library
corner with books that focus
on strong characters of all
genders, promoting stories of
empowerment and equality.
Encourage both boys and
girls to read and discuss
these stories together.

Cut out all the articles in a newspaper that talk about male and female success! Are they evenly balanced? Make a collage to show your findings and talk to the class about this!

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Organize a "Walk in Their Shoes" Day: Everyone gets to pair up with someone of another gender to learn about a day in the life of their partner, understanding different perspectives and challenges they might face because of gender stereotypes.

Develop an Equality Charter for Your School: Work with students, teachers, and staff to create a charter that outlines how everyone will work towards gender equality at school, including respecting everyone's rights and opportunities.

Invite a local politician onto school to talk about what the government is doing to close the gap between genders and how they can assist the school in this plight.

Research a local charity that supports gender equality. What work do they do to achieve this? Invite the CEO into school to talk to everyone about the work they do.

Organize a Gender
Equality Poster Contest:
Get your friends and
classmates to create
posters that promote
gender equality. Display
them around your school
to spread the message.

Collaborate on a Gender
Equality Mural: Work
together on a big, beautiful
mural that represents what
gender equality means to
you and your classmates. It
could be a mix of words and
pictures, showing everyone's
vision of a fair world.

Peer Teaching Sessions:
Older students can prepare
lessons or presentations
about inspiring figures of all
genders who have made
significant contributions to
society, teaching younger
students about equality and
diversity.

Invite a parent to visit school and talk about their experience as a young person and discuss how things have changed today.
