<p><b>Diversity Book Club:</b> Start a book club where you read and discuss books by authors from different cultures, genders, and social backgrounds. Explore how these stories show the importance of equality and social justice.</p>	<p><b>Awareness Posters:</b> Design and display posters around your school that bring attention to different types of inequality. This will educate your friends and teachers about these important issues.</p>		<p><b>Visit an Old people's Home:</b> Pair up with a local senior citizens' center to hear stories of what the older generation faced. Report back to your class about how things have changed.</p>	<p><b>Recycling School Festival:</b> Hold a festival where families bring in clothes and resources they no longer use. Repurpose them and donate them to families in the wider community who need them most.</p>
<p><b>Inequality Timeline:</b> Work together to create a timeline in your classroom that shows important events in the history of civil rights around the world. You can each add a key event and discuss how it helped fight inequality.</p>	<p><b>10 REDUCED INEQUALITIES</b></p>	<p><b>Community Survey:</b> Team up to survey people in your community to find out what inequalities they face. Use what you learn to start projects or campaigns that make a difference.</p>	<p><b>Cross Cultural School Visit:</b> Invite another school with a different religion, culture or faith to visit your school and exchange thoughts and ideas about the inequality each other faces. Make a friend and write to each other each month..</p>	<p><b>Tell Their Story:</b> Find a famous figure that has overcome and stood up to inequality and tell their story a comic book. Duplicate the comic and use it as a resource to teach a younger class about how to stand up for what is right!</p>
<p><b>Local Leader Video Interviews:</b> Interview leaders in your community about what they are doing to reduce inequalities. Share what you find through your school's newsletter or on a community blog.</p>	<p><b>Social Justice Theatre:</b> Put on a play that deals with themes of inequality, such as poverty, disability rights, or racial discrimination. Invite your family and community members to watch and learn.</p>	<p><b>International Day Celebration:</b> Organize a day at school where you celebrate cultures from around the world with food, music, and presentations. This helps everyone learn about and appreciate different backgrounds.</p>	<p><b>Internet Room:</b> Set-up an internet room for families in your community that do not have access to the internet. Parents can use this resource after school drop off to use the services and tools the internet provides.</p>	<p><b>Greeting Card Creation:</b> make series of greeting cards with famous quotes from inspirational people who have tackled inequality. Sell these cards outside school and donate the money to a charity that supports equality.</p>
