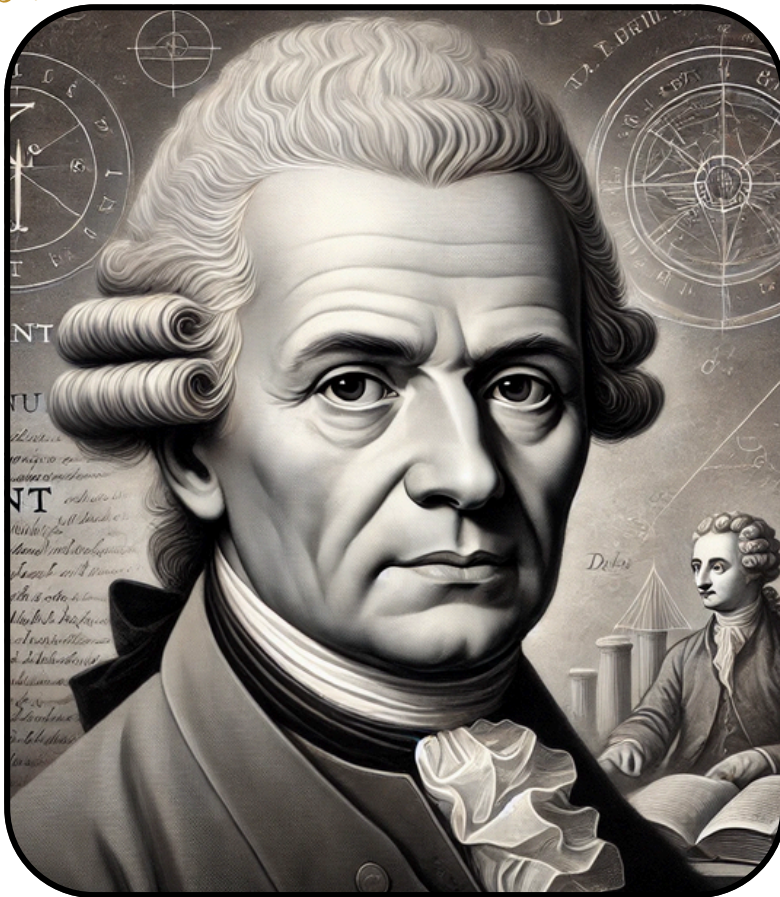


Immanuel Kant
