This page is your **dedication page**. Who are you going to dedicate your book to? (Mum, dad?)

This page is the **first page** of your story. Introduce us to your main character. Tell us a little bit about them and where the story is set.

Let's get the story moving. Tell us what your **main character** is up to? What are they doing or thinking?

Now it is time to introduce us to your **other characters**. How are they related to your main character? (friends, family, enemies)

Let's get the story moving.  
Make your characters have a  
**conversation** and don't forget  
to use "**speech marks**"

Your main character is now going to plan something. Tell us what they are going to do.



On this page, it's time to move  
the story to a new **setting**.  
Where are the **characters** now  
and what are they doing there?

Whatever they had planned is now going to start going wrong.

It is time to introduce the problem. Don't tell us the complication yet, use a **cliffhanger** on this page.

The characters will now discover a problem. It's time for the **complication**. Don't rush this part. You've got ten pages to explain it.

What is the problem they are facing? Make them have a **conversation** about it. Include some **emotions** here.

Do the characters all feel the same about this problem?

**Describe** how the main character feels on this page!

On this page, we want to know  
what the other characters  
**think**. Include **thought bubbles**  
to help explain their thoughts!

On this page, let's get the characters back together to come up with a **plan** to **solve** the problem they are facing. Maybe one of the characters doesn't agree!

It's now time to start solving the problem with some **action**.  
Allow the characters to put their plan into action and change the **setting**.



On this page make the **action happen**. Use good **verbs** and describe what's happening using metaphors, similes and personifications.

It's now time to **solve the problem**. Tell us how they solved it and **how they feel**.

Get the characters back together in a **new location** and make them have a chat about what happened! Use **speech marks**.

On this page we are going to discuss the conclusion to the story. What have the characters **learned** from their epic adventure?

On this page, we want to see the **main character** again. Allow the character to talk to the reader using **speech marks** to teach us all a **valuable lesson**.

This page is where you tell us  
**‘about the author’** include  
something about you and **draw**  
**a picture** too.
