Trees absorb carbon dioxide and provide clean air, making a big impact on the environment.</p>	<p><b>Host a Climate Awareness Assembly:</b> Organize an assembly where students present facts about climate change, its impacts, and ways to combat it. Include skits, presentations, and guest speakers.</p>	<p><b>Energy-Free Day:</b> Challenge the school to go energy-free for a day. Turn off lights, computers, and other electronics to raise awareness about energy consumption.</p>
<p><b>Build Birdhouses and Feeders:</b> Construct birdhouses and feeders to support local wildlife. Distribute them at school and local events to reduce the use of single-use plastic bags.</p>
