Invite somebody to talk to your class over zoom about the work rights and daily expectations of people in another country to develop knowledge of what life is like for others.

Job Shadowing: Partner with a local business to understand their daily work life for a day. Visit the site for a day Document your observations.

Tech Start-Up Day: Utilize technology to brainstorm and pitch a start-up idea that solves a local economic issue. Create presentations or prototypes and present to the class.

Eco-Friendly Product
Design: Students design
and prototype an ecofriendly product that

focusing on sustainable
materials and methods.

Job Swap: help the people who work in your school for one week to see what it is like to work in a job where your role is so important.

Once complete, write a reflection on what working for another person is truly like.

Career Research Project:
Choose a profession and research the education, skills, and path required to achieve it. Present your findings to the class.

Mini Business Fair:
Students create their own small business or product and set up a fair in school to sell to students and teachers, learning about entrepreneurship and financial management firsthand.

Skills Swap Workshop:
Host a workshop where
students teach each other
a skill they're good at,
emphasizing the value of
diverse skills in the
workforce and
community.

Work Rights Role Play:
Organise a play where you act out different workplace scenarios, focusing on workers' rights and ethical dilemmas maybe from history or another country.

Jumble Sale: Ask all the people in your community to bring 1 item they would be willing to sell for a good cause. Then sell them after school and see how much you can raise. Then give the money away to a charity of your choice.
