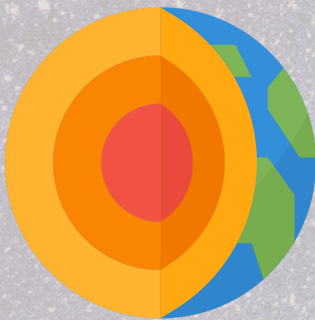
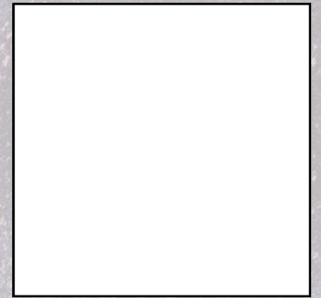
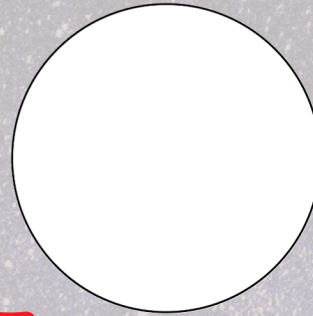
The diameter of the Earth is approximately **12,756 km.**



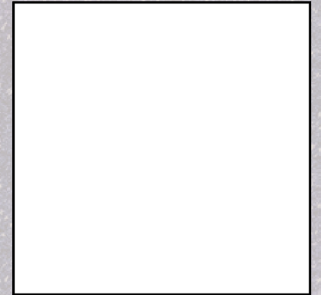
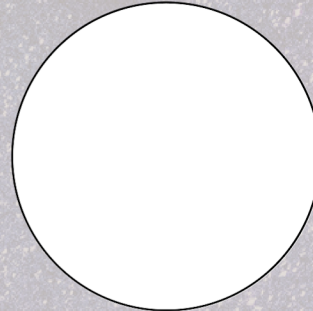
The diameter of the Venus is approximately **12,104 km.**



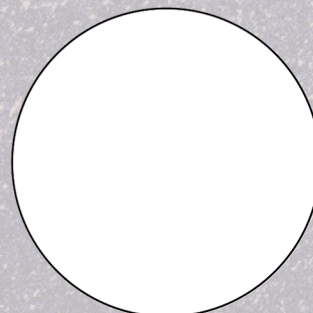
The Earth's crust, which is the outermost layer of the Earth, has an average thickness of about **30 km.**

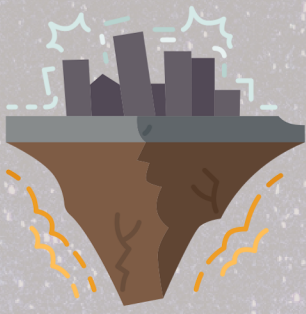


The temperature at the center of the Earth is estimated to be around **6,000** degrees Celsius.

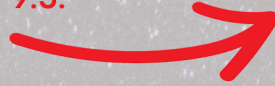
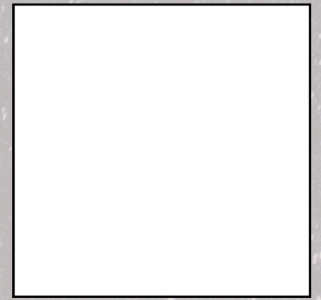
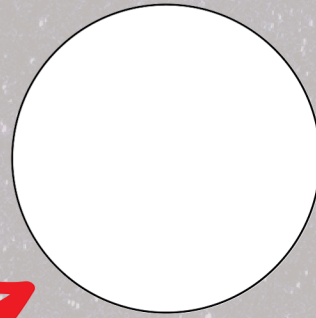


The deepest point on Earth is the Challenger Deep in the Mariana Trench, which is about **11 km** below sea level.

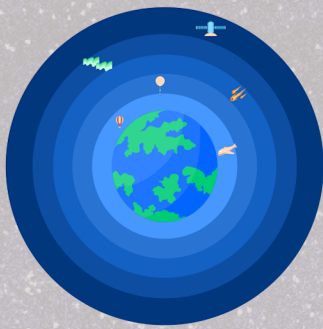
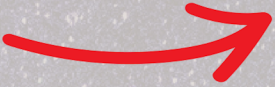
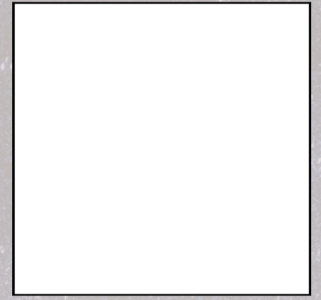
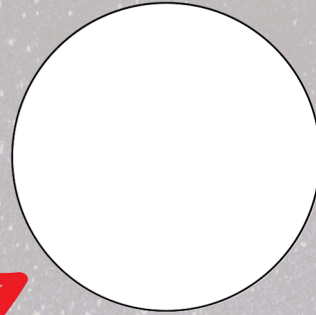




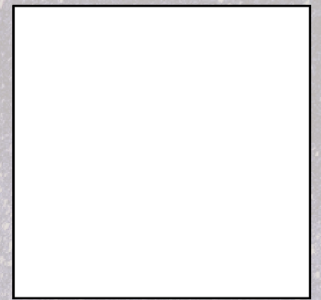
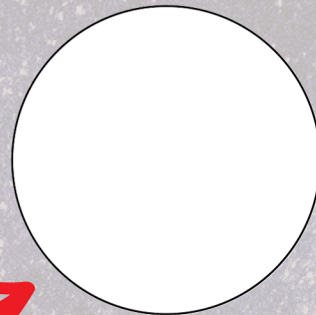
The largest earthquake ever recorded was in Chile, and had a magnitude of **9.5**.



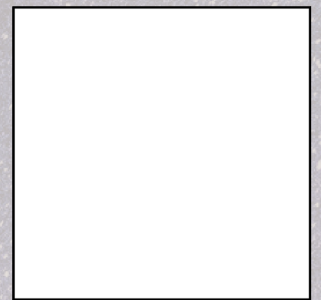
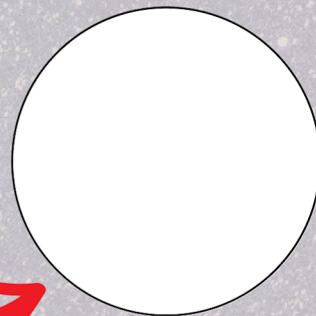
The longest mountain range on Earth is the Mid-Atlantic Ridge, it is **10,000** km long.
