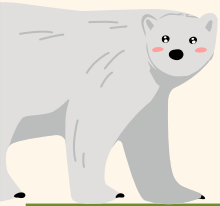


13 Ways to Help Save a Species

Your task: **Complete all 13 specific activities** listed on your task card to help raise awareness about protecting animal diversity. These activities are designed for real-world impact, encouraging community engagement on conservation issues. Focus on making a tangible difference for the animals we're working to protect.



Art Exhibition: Create artwork representing the chosen animal in its habitat, highlighting the beauty and importance of biodiversity. The exhibition can raise awareness and spark conversations within the school community about conservation efforts.

Write an Article: Write an article about the initiatives you are doing in your school and send it to the local and national newspapers in the hope that they publish it and share the news to inspire the world to take action too.



Environmental Film Night: Organize a community screening of documentaries about endangered animals, including a Q&A or panel discussion featuring conservation experts or activists.

Letter to the Prime Minister: Craft a well-researched and persuasive letter to the Prime Minister or relevant government official, advocating for policy changes or support for conservation efforts related to the chosen animal.

Recycling Drive: Organize a recycling campaign linking the importance of recycling to the protection of habitats. Funds raised from recycled goods can support a relevant conservation charity.



Social Media Campaign: Launch a hashtag campaign encouraging people to share information and actions taken to save the chosen animal, aiming to go viral and reach a global audience.

Local Business Collaboration: Partner with local businesses to create awareness displays or donate a portion of sales to conservation efforts, encouraging community support.

Environmental Petition: Start a petition addressing a specific issue affecting the chosen animal and campaign for signatures at community events, aiming to present it to local government officials.

Local Business Partnerships: Partner with local businesses to display information about the chosen animal, offering promotional items or proceeds for a day towards conservation efforts.

Public Speaking Engagements: Students prepare and deliver presentations at community centers or clubs, sharing knowledge about the animal's status and ways the community can help.

Eco-Fashion Show: Students design and create fashion pieces using recycled materials, inspired by the colors, patterns, or habitat of the chosen animal, ending with a show that educates attendees on conservation issues.

Get on the News: Pitch your conservation story to local and national news outlets, aiming to secure a segment that highlights the plight of the chosen animal and the steps being taken to save it.

Digital Storytelling Project: Students create digital stories or comic books about the chosen animal, its habitat, and conservation efforts, sharing these projects on social media or the school website.
